# RECYCLING & SOLID WASTE NEWSLETTER 2014

## Dear Dover Residents and Friends,

This year's Recycling and Solid Waste Newsletter is about progress that shows in great improvements to our solid waste collection and recycling programs. These improvements are part of my comprehensive plan for Quality of Life and fully comport with my plan for Fiscal Responsibility.

In 2012, we instituted single stream recycling, which has proven very easy for our residents and beneficial to our Town on many levels. For example, by implementing this system, we have reduced the number of collections from three days to Fridays only, and thereby saved tax dollars by spending less on resources. In the process of saving money, we reduced pollution and emissions and redistributed our manpower to other projects requiring our attention. I want to personally thank you for your cooperation with this very successful program. After a year in operation, Town residents have adjusted well to the one day a week pick up schedule and our anticipated benefits are being realized on a weekly basis.

In 2013 and 2014 the focus has been and will remain on improving our environmental management infrastructure. For example, necessary renovations and improvements have already taken place at our Department of Public Works (DPW) facility to insure that all of our residents have access to drop off recyclables. The DPW has also expanded its hours of operation to better serve our residents. These improvements to our disposal programs have increased equity, which is one of my core values.

Last year we invested in new recycling containers located in our public parks and business district. All of these containers represent our efforts to consistently improve the beauty of our parks, our community and to participate in recycling, and keep Dover moving in the "green" direction! Residents are utilizing the containers and no doubt this has contributed to less visible trash in our downtown with the added benefit of helping to preserve resources.

Public works is an area of particular interest to me. Insuring that our Town is clean and wholesome gives me great pride. This is why for many of us, "the pride is back in Dover."

## Solid Waste Notes:

- Your solid waste cans shall be placed at the curb by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day, and no earlier than 5:00 PM on the prior evening. Receptacles must be removed by 8:00 PM on collection day.
- You may place for collection a maximum of two cans or bags (30lb. max per bag or can) at the curb for pick-up, two times per week. Additional bags or cans will only be collected if a sticker has been purchased from the Town's Health Dept. or at Town Hall.
- If your pick-up day is canceled due to a holiday or inclement weather, **no make-up date** will be scheduled. However, you will be allowed to put out double on your next scheduled collection day.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Town Health Dept. or at Town Hall prior to pick-up of furniture/bulky waste items (sofas, chairs, mattresses, etc.) These items will be picked up by the Town's Solid Waste Hauler on the day of your regular solid waste pick-up.

## Recycling Notes:

- Residents whose recyclables were missed must contact the Health Department before 10:00 AM on the Monday morning following the collection day at 973-366-2200, Ext. 2120.
- The Recycling Center - located on 211 North Sussex St. - is open on Monday/Wednesday/Friday/Saturday from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM
- Please identify which receptacles are solid waste and which are for recycling. (Stickers available upon request in the Health Dept.) Place containers at curbside by 6:00 AM. Containers shall not exceed 50lbs.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Health Dept. or at Town Hall prior to the pick-up of tires and white goods (appliances). Stickers must be purchased by 3:00 PM on Thursday for Friday pick-up.

- Please flatten all cardboard boxes.
- Empty and rinse all containers
- Put all shredded paper into clear plastic bags, and tie bag securely. Don't use paper bags for shredded paper. Don't shred more paper than necessary. Shred confidential information only.
- Collection container size is limited to 32 gallons (50 lbs). Use more than one container if necessary.

## Acceptable HHW

- Pesticides & Herbicides
- Oil-Based Paints, Stains & Varnishes
- Automotive Fluids:
  - Antifreeze
  - Motor Oil
  - Gasoline
  - Transmission, Steering & Brake Fluids
- Rechargeable Batteries
- Pool and Darkroom Chemicals
- Small Quantities of Asbestos (up to 100lbs, double-bagged, wetted and sealed with duct tape)
- Driveway Sealant
- Roofing Tar
- Propane Cylinders
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs & Ballasts
- Used Computers & Monitors



## Unacceptable HHW

- Latex Paints: These are not hazardous and should be dried out and disposed of with regular trash. To dry out, remove the lid and add an absorbent material, such as cat litter or newspaper, to absorb the moisture. Dispose of the dried paint can out in the trash.
- Empty Containers: Once a container is empty, it is no longer hazardous and should be disposed of with the recyclables or trash in the normal manner.
- Unknown Materials: If unlabeled or unidentifiable, the waste may or may not be acceptable depending upon its physical characteristics. Call for more information.
- Over 220 lbs. of Business Waste: Large quantity hazardous waste generators can not participate in the MCMUA's HHW Program.

# Other Recyclable Items Collected at Curbside by the Department of Public Works and or Accepted at the Dover Recycling Center

## Items Collected Only at Curbside

- **White Goods and Appliances** – For collection of these items a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department or Town Hall prior to pick up. Stickers must be purchased before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday collection. White goods shall include, but are not limited to; refrigerators, stoves, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners, dishwashers, etc.
- **Garden Trimmings** – Consist of twigs, bush trimmings, small branches and plants. Place garden trimmings in a re-usable trash can (30 gal. max.) or biodegradable bags which are available at the DPW at a cost of \$4.00/ten bags.
- **Brush** – Brush is collected April thru December according to the provided schedule. Brush shall be no larger than 4" in diameter and 6' long, tied in bundles and stacked neatly at the curb.
- **Christmas Trees** – Collected January 2nd thru January 31st

## Items Accepted at the Recycling Center Only

- **Used Motor Oil** – Used motor oil must be collected in a reusable plastic container. (Antifreeze and any other liquids are not acceptable)
- **Car Batteries** – Car batteries shall not be leaking. (Household and rechargeable batteries are not acceptable)
- **Large Rigid Plastics** – Acceptable items are; large plastic toys, laundry baskets, soda and milk crates, plastic pet carriers, kitty litter buckets, plastic storage containers, plastic outdoor furniture without pvc pipes, clean 5 gallon buckets without metal handles.
- **Electronics** – See below for requirements and accepted items.

## Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center

- **Tires** - Tires can either be collected curbside or delivered to the Recycling Center. A sticker must be purchased at the Health Department or Town Hall before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday pick-up. The cost for tire disposal is \$3.00 for curbside collection and \$2.00 for tires delivered to the recycling center.
- **Yard Waste (Include Grass and Leaves)** – Yard Waste is collected April thru December in accordance with the provided schedule. Place yard waste in re-usable trash cans (30 gal. max.) or biodegradable bags which are available at the D.P.W. at a cost of \$4.00/ten bags. **(Accepted at recycling center only on Saturdays)**

**NOTE:** Curbside leaf vacuum collection will take place in all sections from October 20, 2014 - December 5, 2014.

## Electronics Recycling

The New Jersey Electronics Recycling Act mandates that as of January 1, 2011 all televisions, portable desktop or personal computers and computer monitors can no longer be disposed of in the landfill and that they be recycled. In addition to the mandated items listed above, the Recycling Center will also accept the following items at no cost;

- Desktop printers and printer / fax / copier / scanner combinations
- Computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, and other devices
- Fax machines; and
- DVD players, VCR's, and other video players (i.e., DVR's)

**NOTE:** Items that are damaged or have been stripped of their electronic components will not be accepted.
