REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
May 26, 2015

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dodd at 7:05 pm

ROLL CALL

Present: Aldermen Visioli, Romaine, Rutan, Noriega, MacDonald, Toth and Mayor Dodd

Absent: Alderman Picciallo and Alderwoman Blackman

Also present were Municipal Clerk Margaret Verga, Administrator Donald Travisano and Attorney Downs

Municipal Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper.

Mayor Dodd opened the meeting to the public on any agenda items. Seeing no hands and hearing no voices, Mayor Dodd closed the meeting to the public.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor reported on the following:

Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening of the Father Connelly Center – was held on Friday May 22nd at 4pm. It was noted that the facility will be used for town events, youth and senior citizen programs.

South Second Street Soccer Field Project – Groundbreaking was held on Friday, May 22nd at 6pm. The field turf installation has begun and the project is on target for a completion date of end of June.

Variable Message Board Project – are being constructed at the JFK Park and Town Hall. The completion date for the project is mid-June and when completed, this project will allow the town to keep its' residents better informed.

NJDOT Public Information Meeting – The New Jersey Department of Transportation held a public information meeting open to all residents and interested parties on Wednesday, May 6, 2015 from 6 pm to 8 pm. Representatives were on hand to explain and answer questions pertaining to the Prospect Street Bridge Project. The project has started, with major work underway in early June. NJDOT forecasts substantial completion for December 31, 2015. Mayor Dodd provided a timeline of the project starting back to 2012.

S. Morris Street Project – Work commenced last week on the signal pre-emption project and the grade crossing surface replacement project. The projects are expected to be completed by the end of June. Potential one way closures are expected from May 29 through June 1 and June 4 through June 8.

2014 Small Cities Grant – The 2014 Small Cities grant project is well underway and progress is being realized. This project is utilizing nearly \$500,000 of federal funds, which was awarded via a competitive grant. The project is taking place in the Baker, Fairview and Pequannock Street area and consists of road reconstruction, sewers, water main/lines, milling and paving. Completion is scheduled for July.

Town Newsletter – Mailed out and received two weeks ago. The administration has gotten great feedback from residents on all of the town's initiatives and the town's efforts to communicate them to the residents.

(Semi) Town Clean-up day - scheduled for Saturday. The town is allowing one car load of garbage except for white goods.

Everbridge Reverse 911 – Reminded residents to register for alerts, specific information for registering is on the town's webpage.

Movie Schedule – All at JFK 7 pm (1) Friday May 29th Big Hero Six, (2) Friday June 26th The Boxtrolls, (3) July 31st E.T., (4) Friday August 28th The Lego Movie.

Mayor's 10th Annual Fishing Derby – was held on May 16, 2015 at Hurd Park. DPW did a great job getting Hurd Park ready. The event was successful and well-attended by area children. He thanked everyone involved especially all the business that donated money and or prizes.

CONSENT AGENDA

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE TRANSPARENT TAX ACT OF 2015 ASSEMBLY BILL NO. A-4325

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. A-4325 supplementing Chapter 4 of Title 54, R.S. 54:4-65 and designated the “Transparent Tax Act of 2015” is being considered for adoption by the New Jersey State Assembly; and

WHEREAS, amendment would permit the local jurisdiction to print separate tax bills to each taxpayer, one showing the amount of property taxes due and payable for municipal tax purposes, the other shall state the amount of property taxes due and payable for county purposes, school purposes, fire district purposes, and for the purposes of any other special district on behalf of which the municipality collects property taxes; and

WHEREAS, both bills shall include a brief tabulation showing the distribution of the total amount to be raised by taxes; and

WHEREAS, A-4325 would require the municipal tax collector to send notice of the pro rata share, if any, of the property tax appeal refunds paid by the municipality during the tax year to the county, school districts, and fire districts for inclusion in their annual budgets; and

WHEREAS, in the following tax year in which the refunds were paid, the municipal tax collector is then required to deduct the applicable pro rata share if the property tax refund from the amounts to be paid to the county, and each school and fire district; and

WHEREAS, these amendments, if adopted, will assist the general public to understand the tax bill, the structure of the taxes, and the level of support for each agency, and will further provide a more equitable structure to share the obligation of paying approved tax appeals as the title states, creates transparency in the tax supporting local assessments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris, and State of New Jersey, hereby supports Assembly Bill A-4325 amending Title 54:4-65 and urges the Legislature to approve and pass the bill for the reasons herein; and, hereby urge the swift passage and signing of S-1896/A-1503; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the members of the NJ State Assembly, the members of the NJ Senate, the Governor of the State of NJ, the NJ, State League of Municipalities, the Municipal Clerks’ Association of NJ, and all Morris County municipalities.

ORDINANCE NO. 09-2015

ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER PROVIDING FOR HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACE AT 83 HARDING AVE.
